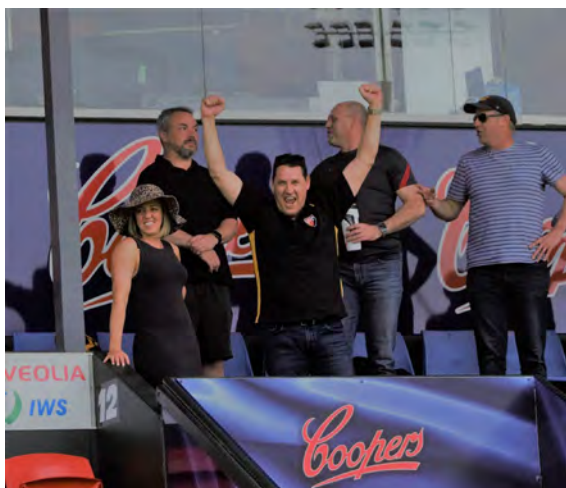

Facilities Report: Mark Goodman

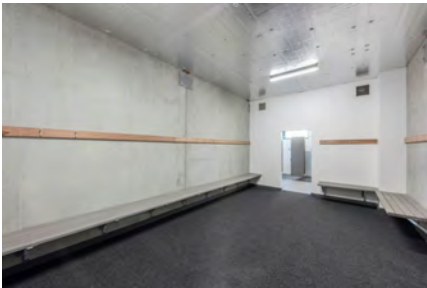

Senior Football Director's Report: Daniel Norton

What a remarkable season it has been. Our senior men's pre-season campaign that commenced in November with such high hopes under new coach Luke Donaldson was threatened in mid-March by a global pandemic. Who could have predicted that? Through no fault of our own, a season that was about to commence with great promise after a strong pre-season was thrown into a disarray and doubt due to COVID-19, and before a ball was bounced to start the season, the season was put on indefinite hold.

It was a credit to Luke, captain Lou Whitelock and his leadership group that the entire men's program remained totally connected during the shutdown period and totally prepared for when the season did commence.



The Division 1 senior team started slowly losing the first three games of the season. Essentially, in a reduced nine game season, every game from this point became an elimination final if we were to qualify for finals. From this point, we did not lose a game for the remainder of the season. In a remarkable turnaround, we won our final six minor round games by an average winning margin of 62 points. Our winning form continued through the finals with gutsy wins against PAOC in the Qualifying Final and against minor premiers SPOC in the Second Semi-Final. It set up a Grand Final against ROC at Norwood Oval on a blustery, overcast Sunday afternoon on the first weekend in October. ROC kicked with the breeze in the first quarter and led by 13 points at quarter time, and given the strength of the breeze this quarter set us up for the remainder of the game. We enjoyed a dominant second quarter kicking 6.7 to 0.1 to lead by 29 points at half-time. ROC responded with the breeze in the third quarter to cut our lead to only eight points at three-quarter time. In a classic last quarter arm wrestle, we finished strongly, thanks to a remarkable snap goal from Frazer Goodes to claim a famous premiership by 16 points. Congratulations to Nick Burgess who was rightfully awarded best-on-ground for his outstanding four-quarter, two-goal performance. The Grand Final win was symbolic of the year itself. Despite all the challenges thrown at the group the players and coaches just found a way to win. They stood tall against great odds and could have easily put up the white flag early in the season. Instead, they responded to claim one of the most memorable premierships in our club's history.



Congratulations to Division 1 best-and-fairest winner Nick Favretto on an outstanding home coming. To be awarded best-and-fairest in a premiership season is something you should be incredibly proud of. It's nice to have you back. Furthermore, congratulations to Nick for also being selected in the Adelaide Footy League team of the year alongside teammates Tom Carter, Jacob Hughes and Tom Edwards. Well done to each of you on your outstanding seasons and selection in this representative team.

On behalf of the entire club, I thank and congratulate the senior coaching group Luke Donaldson, Tom Pysing, Aaron Bayliss, Murray Hamblin, Matt Illman, Craig Kirkbright, Darren Loffler, Doon and Steve Partington. The amount of work this coaching group put in behind the scenes, planning training, keeping the group connected through the COVID shutdown, analysing footage, watching opposition games and working with players was elite. I personally thank the entire coaching group for making me feel so welcome in such a challenging year for us all.

Huge congratulations also to our Division 1 reserves team led by coach Ben Johnston. It was a most consistent season by our Division 1 reserves team who completed the minor round as minor premiers with eight wins and one loss.

Similar to our Division 1 team, we won our last seven minor round games in the Division 1 reserves competition by an average winning margin of 62 points. As minor premiers we enjoyed a week off before defeating SPOC by 13 points in the Second-Semi Final to proceed through to the Grand Final. A fortnight later we met SPOC in the Grand Final at Norwood Oval and won a thrilling game by 2 points to claim the premiership.

Thanks and congratulations to Ben Johnston and his assistant coach David Serotzki on an outstanding season. Losing only one game for the season tells only part of the story. Your tireless efforts to keep the playing group connected across this season at training and on game-day is a credit to you both. Not only were you rewarded with premiership success, but you have continued the winning culture of our club, particularly for future A-grade players in years to come. This cannot be underestimated.

And a massive congratulations to club legend Simon Brooks on reaching the magical 300 game milestone this season. It is a testimony to your dedication, commitment and preparation in representing Goodwood Saints with such distinction over such a long period. You should be very proud of this extraordinary achievement.

Congratulations also to Daniel Payne and the C-1 playing group on your season as well. We completed the minor round in 4th position with six wins and three losses. We then defeated Port Districts in the elimination final by four points, SPOC by eight points in the First-Semi Final, and PAOC by 30 points in the Preliminary Final to proceed through to the Grand Final. The Grand Final turned out to be the one that got away. Despite having five more scoring shots and a difficult chance late to draw the game, we fell an agonising five points short of winning the C1 premiership and making it a clean sweep at men's senior level.
